PRESIDENT'S PAGE

Again, we had another **successful annual meeting** at Community Covenant Church in Lenexa, Kansas. A lot of information was exchanged; new people attended; new professionals to the Network came; a nice buffet lunch was provided; and, thank goodness, we had nice weather. I want to thank all those who stuffed packets, helped set up, facilitated the small groups, took notes, helped with lunch and drinks and anything else that was required to make this meeting a success. We had 90 register, but only 72 attended. I will admit that the cost of gas had me worried that our attendance would be lower than in years past.

We introduced our **new flyers** for Heartland Quilt Network. Each member was given several in their packet, and more were handed out at the meeting. We encourage everyone to hand them out when they are talking to quilters and quilt guilds. Our quilt guild membership is falling. Professionals, could you talk about HQN when you present a program to a guild? We ordered 2,500 pamphlets so there are plenty to go around. Call if you would like to have some.

We have a **new President for HQN**. Her name is **Hazel Meade from St. Joseph, Missouri**. She has been the Vice President for the last two years, and she will take over in July. We bid a sad farewell to two Board members, **Julie Kiffin** (one of the founding members of HQN) and **Suzanne Henage**, a past Vice President. Both have been loyal supporters for many years.

Our website should be back in operation after having a really bad crash. However, we are still finding places where it needs to be "tweaked". So be sure to let us know if you find a problem and it will be corrected.

I have been researching **our history**. The first annual meeting was in 2003 in North Kansas City with 51 people attending. We had a cute little box lunch, but that was a disaster because more people attended than registered. (I did not know at the time to order 5 more lunches than registered.) When I went to get my box lunch, there were none left!! I don't do well without my lunch!! Fortunately, it was fairly substantial so several of us sat together and shared lunches. (Now you see why we have a buffet.) We have learned with each of the **nine annual meetings**. Sometimes we have had speakers; sometimes we don't. We have met in five different places; some were wonderful and some were not. But it has always been inspiring to hear what people have to say and to hear what they are doing. My hope is that HQN will continue on for many years despite the higher price of gas and fabric.

BREAKING NEWS ON PRINTING BROCHURES

Heartland Quilt Network ordered their new brochures from www.gotprint.com. For \$173.60 and \$31.35 in postage and handling, a total of \$204.95, we got 2,500 tri-fold brochures. They are 8 1/2" x 11", full color, on 80 lb. Gloss Book with Aqueous Coating paper. Turn around time for printing after proof reading was about a week. We suggest that all you professionals, quilt guilds and shop owners check this out. Of course, you can order number you want to; we just decided that we wanted 2,500, and we could not beat the price locally. This website was recommended by one of our officers who heard about it from a very picky friend. We were very happy with the results of our brochure.

FAREWELL FROM NANCY

I have been an officer in Heartland Quilt Network since 2000, when I was the Treasurer. In 2001 I was Treasurer/Membership and in 2002 I became the President. We accomplished a lot during the last nine years. We had our **first annual all-day meeting**. We wrote by-laws and got our non-profit status with the IRS. The **newsletter** has expanded and is a wealth of information. We have had one **opportunity quilt**, and learned a lot about that. We have touched upon many topics but probably the most discussed is the **copy right laws for quilters**. We have had many **small group discussions** for both Quilt Guilds and Professionals.

To me, the most important idea is that the **quilt guilds** need to be careful with their money, have by-laws or standing rules, and work as a professional club. We hope that HQN has provided the tools to make that possible. And, **the professionals** needed a way to connect with Guilds. I think that the Network has provided

that. The **Quilt Shops and vendors** have sort of lost out, but we are dedicating our November newsletter to them, and hopefully that helps them advertise what makes them special.

One of the early things we did was to compile as much as we could of information that came out in group discussions. These compilations are part of the **Member's Only section** on the website. I urge everyone to go there, read the information provided and use it. The User Name is **hqnetwork** and the Password is **one2one**. I am sure that topics will continue to be added.

Finally, I want to say **thank you** to all the people who have served on the Board of Directors for the last nine years. I have enjoyed working with each and every one of you. We brainstormed so many ideas; some worked; some did not; and some never got off the ground. But working with

quilters is fun because the imagination and patience that shows up in the quilting experience also shows up when the Board is working. It is difficult to work together when we are spread out over so much area, but we managed to make it happen. For many years we had face to face meetings, but with the compressed time that most of us have now and the price of gas, we have now gone to email Board meetings. They work but not as well as talking together as a group.

Thank you for the opportunity of being the President of HQN for the last nine years. Congratulations to Hazel Meade. Please support her as you have me. I will be traveling with my husband and doing a lot more quilting, but I will stay on the Board as the Past President. So I will see many of you again.
