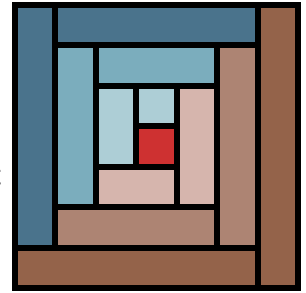

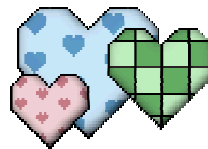
LIBRARY

Quilt Show

Need to Know

Here are items you need to know for the quilt show. We will be adding more as the quilt show gets closer.

Dates: Saturday, September 26 – Sunday, October 11

Entries: An entry form is needed for each quilt you enter in the show. You also must fill out a Release and Waiver form – several quilts can be listed on that form. Forms are available at guild meetings and in the newsletter. Entry forms are to be turned in to Candy Hargrove by August 17.

Talk to us: Be sure to tell the story of your quilt on the entry form. Visitors at the show spend a lot of time reading those and enjoy your stories.

Measure Carefully: When filling out your entry forms, measure your quilts carefully. Crown Center uses those measurements to build their hanging structures.

Boutique: Make as many items for the Boutique as you can.

Size: A quilt will be considered “large” if the width is at least 60” and the length is at least 70”. Quilts smaller than those dimensions will be considered “wall” quilts. All “large” quilts must have a sleeve.

How to make a sleeve:

- * Cut or piece together fabric to make a strip 9” tall and the same width as the quilt.
- * Fold under short ends ¼”, wrong sides together. Fold under again. Sew a straight or zigzag seam to hem the folds.
- * Fold the strip lengthwise, wrong sides together, aligning the raw edges. Sew together with a ½” seam. Press the seam allowance open.
- * Place the open seam against the quilt’s back. Center and pin the top edge of the tube to the back of the quilt, about ½” below the binding.
- * Use a whipstitch to sew the top edge of the tube to the quilt backing. Stitch into the batting occasionally to help strengthen the seam.
- * Smooth the sleeve downward along the quilt back, and then make a ½” fold along its length to create a pleat. Leaving the pleat intact, pin the sleeve bottom to the quilt.
- * Whipstitch the lower edge of the sleeve to the quilt. Remove pins. The sleeve will pooch out a bit to allow space for a hanging rod.
- * Whipstitch the back sides of the sleeve to the quilt. Leave the front sides unsewn to allow for rod insertion.

Hostess: * Sign up to be a white-glove hostess at the quilt show – you will have a great time, meet guild members and talk to the public about quilting.

Mayor’s Christmas Tree Fund: (Small Quilt Registration Form)

- * Make a small quilt to sell to benefit the Mayor’s Christmas Tree Fund. The total length of all sides cannot exceed 96”.

RELEASE & WAIVER

I, the undersigned, owner of a quilted display piece to be exhibited at Crown Center as part of the **33rd Annual Heart of America Quilt Show**, September 26 to October 11, 2009, release Crown Center from liability for damage or theft of said quilt(s) while on the premises of Crown Center. I understand that the Quilters Guild of Greater Kansas City will provide exhibit hostesses during all show hours; and that items in the Showplace will be locked and secured after hours, and that professional security will be employed by Crown Center and stationed in the Level 1 Atrium after show hours to assure reasonable safety of the quilts.

I understand that Crown Center will further take all reasonable precautions to protect quilts from damage by sunlight, hanging, or vandalism; however, I do understand that, in the event such precautions fail, Crown Center is not covered for such liability, and does not accept such liability. Aforementioned quilt piece is covered by my individual homeowner's insurance policy or other appropriate insurance policy.
